The staff were proud to have witnessed their growth both in terms of character and skill. As part of the ski trip students also enjoyed a pizza and bowling night and opportunity to watch Morzine vs Mount Blanc in the Ice Hockey grand final.





Year 9 Ski Trip, Overtauern, Austria

It was an early start from School as we got on the coach at 6am on the Saturday morning, with lots of parents with tears in their eyes as they waved their children goodbye. These were clearly not tears of sadness but tears of joy at having a whole week without their little cherubs!





47 students and 6 staff through airport security and we were on our way to Munich, before transferring by coach to Obertauern.

We were staying at the Gottshallam, a typical, Austrian-styled guesthouse set high among the pine trees and mountains of the Alps (which we would later regret due to the climb back up to it from the slopes).

As the resort is 1,740 metres above sea-level, climbing to 2,863 metres at its highest

peak, the snow conditions were excellent, with an initial snowfall as we arrived and then a number of blue-sky days to follow.

The beginners were initially catastrophic, with many students not believing they would ever be able to ski or, more importantly, stop. But I've been here many times before and one of the joys of running the trip is to see students' confidence and progression exponentially increase until, by the end of the week, everyone has skied from the top to the bottom of the mountain, which includes blue and red pistes, along with a timed slalom race.



The outdoor swimming one evening was a big hit, as was the Tyrolean folk-dancing evening, where we live-streamed to the parents the students getting fully involved in the thigh-slapping, bench-slamming and hat swapping dances, along with bell-ringing and Alpine-Horn-blowing.

The journey back home went smoothly, and we arrived back at school the following Saturday at 1.30am to a set of parents who all looked strangely fresh-faced and happy, which was no doubt due to getting their cherubs back... or was it the lovely, relaxing week they had just had without them?

As usual, the kids were brilliant throughout the trip and were a real credit to both their families and the school, which made the staff very proud to spend the week in their company.

Bebra Exchange

The year 2024 marks the 50th Anniversary of exchange between King James's School in Knaresborough and Brüder Grimm Gesamtschule in Bebra; a partnership first established in 1974 by former member of staff, Alan Hemsworth, who still to this day, despite having retired over ten years ago, plays an important role in the existence of the exchange. He worked closely with Jochen Hasse, an English teacher in Bebra to establish this amazing partnership. Before our departure, we were fortunate to receive some funding from Knaresborough Town Council to help celebrate this milestone. All participants were bought hoodies displaying our logo depicting our strapline "50 Years of Friendship". In addition to the hoodies, we were able to gain entrance to Wartburg Castle in Eisenach, a UNESCO World heritage Centre, on a joint day visit with our German partners as well as enjoying an evening of bowling, thanks to the generosity of the



town Council. What a fabulous way to celebrate this momentous occasion between the two schools!

During the week, students attended lessons in the German school, toured the town of Bebra, went bowling at the Hyppo Bowling alley, sampled German cuisine and there was even a group of families who travelled to Frankfurt to see the sights.


The evening of celebration to mark the 50th anniversary took place in the Lokschuppen in Bebra, a well renowned an impressive event venue in the town. The venue was thronged with 180 guests most of whom had either present involvement with the exchange or who were themselves previous participants on the exchange. The 50th anniversary event was a true highlight, not just during exchange week but a remarkable milestone event during our 50 years of friendship between the two schools and communities.

Our final full day in Hessen was spent in school, followed by a visit to Bad Hersfeld, a spa town in the vicinity. A tour of the town with our hosts was followed by shopping time for gifs and souvenirs before our last evening with our German families and friends.

Our twenty-hour journey culminated in us arriving back at KJS at 3:45 am...we were all very tired after an eventful and most memorable trip to Bebra! We will see our friends back in Knaresborough in 2025.
