Returning to school in September

Arrangements for the first week back in September are as follows:

- Monday 1st September 2025 : Staff training day; school will be closed to students.
- Tuesday 2nd September: Year 7 and 12 students ONLY. On arrival, Year 7 students should go straight to Chaloner Hall.
- Wednesday 3rd September 2025: All students return to school.

A reminder that access to the school site for students is from 8.20am, at which time staff will open gates and will be there to meet and greet students, who may go to their Year Hubs or to the dining hall for breakfast.

All students need to be onsite by 8.40am.

Access points into school are as follows:

Uniform reminders

Over the summer, parents may be buying new uniform. Below are some reminders about uniform expectations:

- Minimal modifications to kilts.

- Black socks or green or black tights.
