## KJS uniform expectations

As stated in our planner and in previous communications, acrylic nails are not permitted in school. Please support your child with the removal of their acrylic nails by Monday 29th April. After this date students will be working in our 'consequence room' until the issue is rectified. Please note also that nail varnish of any description is not allowed to be worn in Food Technology lessons for hygiene, health and safety reasons.

We welcome everyone to attend our annual Spring Concert this year.




## Parking around school
