Please see below for a reminder of our policy around vaping:

- Vaping is prohibited on school grounds.
- Any vape products found will be confiscated and disposed of.
- Possession or suspected use will result in serious sanctions.
- Possible suspension, even for association or presence during vaping.
- Suspensions will remain on a student's school record.

Government guidance allows authorised school staff to search pupils, even without their consent, where they have "reasonable grounds for suspecting that the pupil may have a prohibited item. This includes vapes. The flyer included at the end of this newsletter provides useful information for parents/carers around vaping.
