




#### Battle of Townton visit

# Learning Cycle 1 Rewards Celebrations



These students will have received their certificate in their assemblies, containing a personal message from the member of staff they have received this from, they will also be awarded 10 positive points and a golden star with their name on will be added to their Tutor groups 'Hall of Fame' Amazingly, some students have managed to collect more than one in Learning Cycle One. 

You will be begging to read the next book in this engaging series – Thunderhead.


