Once again we have been celebrating a fantastic set of exam results this summer, both at GCSE and A-Level. Last year's Year 11 cohort made above expected progress, with over 120 students gaining entry into our sixth form. Our A-Level results were just as pleasing, with 91% of those students who applied for university gaining a place, and 83% of them getting their first choice.

We welcome your continued support in reinforcing our values of Ready, Respectful and Engaged with your child. Our external school gates open at 8.20am and all students should be on site by 8.40am. Your support around a punctual start to the day is important in ensuring that all students are ready to learn.

I really look forward to welcoming you all to school and sharing more information around our vision and values at next week's Expectations Evenings.

We appreciate these situations are often sensitive, but we thank parents/carers in advance for their understanding and support in facilitating these visits.

Assemblies

Assemblies next week are varied and aim to meet the specific needs of each year group.

Year 7 will have an assembly led by Mr King linked to our school value of READY and focused on 'settling in' designed to make students feel confident and supported as they begin life at King James's School.

Homework

King James's is a homework school. We expect our students to complete homework to the best of their ability and hand homework in on time. We want all students to write homework tasks and deadlines in planners and teachers will also set homework on Bromcom. This means you can access this from home on MyChildAtSchool so you can see what homework is set and can support your child in the completion of their homework. All students can access homework resources and deadlines set on Bromcom using the student portal so they can see what homework has been set on their phone. There will be more information for parents and students about homework outlined in the Parent Expectations Evenings and assemblies.

It is important students complete homework:

- To enable students to develop the skills needed for independent study.
- To enable students to meet the demands of examined courses including coursework where relevant.
- To review, practise, broaden and consolidate learning which has taken place within the classroom, including in preparation for assessment.

Attendance

It has been wonderful to see our students return to school this week. The start of a new year always brings a mix of excitement and nerves, for students and staff alike, and that's perfectly natural. We want to reassure you that these feelings are part of settling back in, and we are here to support every child as they get into new routines.

You may have seen the recent news highlighting how important regular attendance is, especially in these first few weeks. Getting the routines right at the start of the year helps to generate good habits which will last during the year ahead. Beyond the clear link to academic progress, being present helps students build friendships and form strong relationships with their teachers, connections that make a real difference throughout the year.

At our school, we set a 96% attendance expectation, which enables them to 'Set No Limits on what they achieve'. That's the equivalent of not missing more than 8 school days in the year. The government defines persistent absence as attendance below 90% (around 19 missed days a year). To ensure we can give the right support at the right time: To make tracking easier, we've introduced a few new steps this year:

Students will record their weekly attendance with their form tutor in their planner. Parents will be notified if attendance begins to dip, this is simply to help you keep track alongside us.



A few important reminders:

- Holidays during term time: fines are now in place for absences of 5 days (10 sessions) within a 10-week period. A holiday form must be completed, and if you believe you meet the criteria for an exception, you will have a chance to explain this on the form. Even if a holiday is not declared, if we receive evidence, it will still be recorded as such.
- School times: The day begins at 8:40am. Students must arrive before 9:15am to receive their morning mark, and between 1:15 1:45pm for their afternoon mark.
- Punctuality: Due to the link between punctuality to school and attendance, If a student is late more than twice in a week, parents will be notified, and the student will be placed on an attendance tracker for two weeks. If there is no improvement, we will invite parents in to explore ways to move forward together.

Above all, please know that our goal is to see every child succeed and attendance is a crucial aspect of this. We will support you and your child every step of the way, and we deeply value your partnership in helping us maintain high attendance and punctuality. Communication between school and families is the key to positive outcomes.




