Uniform Standards Drive

We are proud to have high expectations and, as you are aware, after half term we are having a sustained drive to improve the standards of uniform. Most students are very smart anyway and we thank parents for your support. We hope that by working with parents since Christmas, together we have resolved any ongoing issues and that we will have very few issues to deal with when we come back from our break. Just a final reminder of things to check with your children please so that we can have a positive start to next half term – thank you!

Entry to school – students will be warmly welcomed into school via the gate for their year group (Y7, 8, 11 - S1 gate, and Y9, 10, 6th Form – Sixth Form gate). Their uniform will checked

as they enter school and again in their year Hubs and again at form time. Students will be supported to correct their uniform if necessary, by being offered a loan item for the day where possible. In addition it may be appropriate to contact home to see if missing or correct items can be brought in. Any students who refuse to adhere to our expectations will be kept out of circulation until the matter is resolved.

Shoes - must be a plain black shoe style. It is preferrable that students wear the formal shoe, but we now accept the plain black, flat-soled leather 'leisure shoe' as an alternative. Trainer-soles are not permitted.

Kilts - must be appropriate for a school setting and be a reasonable length (below mid-thigh). Students will be asked to unroll kilts that are too short and students with kilts that are still too short will be asked to wear trousers and will be kept out of circulation until the matter is resolved.







Trousers - all students can wear trousers, which can

be slim-fit but must not be leggings / jeggings. A useful rule of thumb is that they should have a zip and/or buttons.

Outdoor clothing – must be removed in school. This includes coats and hoodies (including the KJS-branded PE hoodie).

Blazers/jumpers – should be worn at all times on corridors but may be removed in lessons so that students are comfortable.
