Uniform reminder

A reminder about our uniform expectations, in particular with regards to trousers. Trousers should be plain black - black jeans, leggings, (including flared leggings) and jeggings are not acceptable. Trousers should be plain black, have a waistband, button/fly and no combat pockets. This applies to all students who choose to wear trousers.

Students are encouraged to wear different combinations of the school uniform to ensure they are comfortable when attending school. There must be either Royal or Hunting Stewart tartan present, this can be worn through the kilt or ties. Thank you for your support.

Attendance

Attendance continues to be a national challenge, with figures still rising back towards pre-pandemic levels. A recent Department for Education webinar highlighted that, across the country, many absences are due to children missing the occasional day. Here at King James, we are committed to turning this around. Our goal is to raise our attendance from last year's 91.1% to at least 91.5% this year. A small increase that would mean an incredible 1,098 additional days of learning.



Of course, the recent wave of bugs and viruses has certainly tested everyone's resilience, and we know Mother Nature hasn't made things easy. We're incredibly grateful to our families who continue to do their very best to ensure children are in school whenever they are able. When students are genuinely unwell, we completely understand the need for rest and recovery.

In most situations, medical evidence is not required if your child is too ill to attend. However, for children who are frequently absent due to illness, we may ask for evidence so that we can better understand what support they might need to thrive in school. In a small number of cases where we feel the child may have been well enough to attend and a conversation doesn't resolve the concern, we may request evidence, but please be assured this is always done with your child's wellbeing and success at heart.

If we don't have an absence form you will receive either a call or a text in the morning, as a safeguarding measure.

Even if an absence form has been complete, if your child is below 90% attendance you may still get a 'check in' phone call in the afternoon to confirm return date, along with an offer for any support or request medical evidence if needed.



Year 7 and 8 Girls Football




