



The Personal Social Health Citizenship Economic Education programme is delivered in timetabled lesson across years 7 to 11. It seeks to address topics and issues relevant to students' moral and social development and to integrate cross-curricular themes such as Health and Environment Education. Lessons are tailored to support the needs of our students and local community. Students will study a range of topics which develop important life skills and produce active citizens that contribute positively to society.

Students are encouraged to; express their thoughts and feelings, discuss emotions, develop an awareness of right and wrong, have respect for others, understand how to keep themselves and others safe, resolve conflict through developing tolerance, participate in group and class discussions, form opinions through informed choice, consider moral challenges and plan for the future.

By using the latest resources and information gathered from the PSHE Association, Growing up in North Yorkshire Survey and partner organisation our curriculum confidently reflects the world we live in. To ensure challenge and progress students learning is mapped out through the years following a reciprocal and reflective pathway. This learning is confirmed through effective teaching practice, assessment, learning walks, internal work scrutiny and student voice. Our curriculum content is designed to build up and expand prior knowledge within PSHCEE and across departments. PSHCEE is a truly student-centred approach to learning which focuses on supporting young people and their future aspirations.
