What are their central themes? What questions might be asked about them? The Handmaid's Tale and Frankenstein Try writing thesis statements on the topics of Identity, Religion, Narrative Voice, Women's Roles, Nature/Nurture, (manipulation of)
Week 7 Wb 31 st Jan	 Hamlet Create plans for responses to three questions from the Hamlet pack. Write a timed response for one of these questions. Check you have a strong thesis statement / big idea / main answer to the question. Unseen Poetry Choose two poems – one from Poems of the Decade and one from your Unseen Poetry collection. Compose your own exam essay question for these poems. What do you think the focus might be? Write an exploration and comparison of these poems.
Week 8 wb 7 th Feb	 Plan responses to Streetcar questions below. Try writing one essay in full. Explore how Williams presents desire in A Streetcar Named Desire. You must relate your discussion to relevant contextual features. Explore how Williams presents relationships in A Streetcar Named Desire.
