Information on the Geography Department

The Geography Department team is led by a supportive subject leader and has 4 team members. One of the primary aims of the department is to stimulate interest and enthusiasm for the subject, and as a result we have many students who opt to take Geography at Key Stage 4 and 5. The department aims to stimulate student interest in their surroundings, inspire a sense of responsibility for the environment and increase their knowledge of places at a range of scales. Fieldwork is an essential part of the curriculum and students across the key stages take part in local fieldwork exercises. The Department also runs a residential trip to Iceland.

At all Key Stages, standards of attainment are consistently well in excess of national averages. At GCSE results are outstanding; last year 83% of entries were graded 9-4 and 35% were graded 9/7. We endeavour to develop, in all students, a love of the subject and a thirst for learning. A variety of teaching and learning methods are used, incorporating both individual and group activities, develop each student's written, oral and practical skills.

Key Stage 3 Geography is delivered over three years and in line with the National Curriculum. It aims to enthuse pupils whilst preparing them for Key Stage 4. At Key Stage 4 pupils study The Challenge of Natural Hazards, Living World, Physical Landscapes in the UK (Rivers and Coasts), Urban Issues and Challenges, The Challenge of Resource Management (Food) and The Changing Economic World. The exam board is AQA.

Interest in studying Geography at post-16 is very strong and the department has had consistently excellent results. The course elements are: a Geography Fieldwork Investigation, Water and Carbon Cycles, Coastal Systems and Landscapes, Hazards, Global Systems and Global Governance, Changing Places and Contemporary Urban Environments. The exam board is AQA.

Careful monitoring of all students' performance throughout their time at King James's School enables us to set high and clear targets for each student and give them effective feedback to maximise their potential in the subject.

Information on the Humanities Faculty

We have 6 dedicated specialist History teachers who aim to inspire students and develop a passion for the subject. It is an extremely popular subject and take up at GCSE and A Level is strong. Results are outstanding due to the experience and commitment of the team to deliver high quality teaching and learning. At Key Stage 3 some of the topics studied include The Norman Conquest, Medieval Society, The Crusades, Tutor Monarchs, The English Civil War, Native American Indians, The Industrial Revolution and World War I and II. The Department also runs residential trips to Berlin and the Battlefields.

Religious Studies helps students develop a sensitive, reflective and informed approach to the religious dimensions of life, and to instill a genuine, open-minded curiosity in the diversity of religious beliefs. Our Key Stage 3 course includes themes such as community, origins of religions, founders and leaders, Philosophical questions about belief, science and religion, good and evil, human rights, and other moral, ethical, spiritual and cultural issues.

Applicants will be expected to deliver some Key Stage 3 teaching in both history and religious studies and will teach geography across the full age range.
