<u>Component 2</u>: Introduction to Practitioners & Styles– Epic Theatre, Total Theatre, Physical Theatre, Naturalism. Practical exploration, analysis and application of relevant skills, techniques.

<u>Component 3</u>: Extract 1. Introduction to Classical (Elizabethan/Jacobean). Solo Performance / Monologue Skill. Interpretation, rehearsal and performance.
