
Percentage of children using social media












But technology can affect children's development...

- Sleep cycles are affected by blue light from screens

1. Treat others as you would like to be treated



2. If you wouldn't say it to someone in person don't say it online



3. People can't see your body language, facial expressions or hear the tone of your voice online – so don't over-use icons and punctuation to convey meaning

5. Don't start rumours or spread gossip about someone online



6. Don't make fun of someone in an online chat


























"Our study showed that there is a significant correlation between reading ability (as measured by the New Group Reading Test, a termly, standardised reading assessment) and GCSE results across all subjects.

This was not just the case in English, but in maths and science too. Indeed, the correlation between good literacy and good student outcomes at GCSE was higher in maths (0.63) than in some arts subjects like history (0.61) and English literature (0.60)."











How can you help?

- Check MyChildAtSchool to see what homework has been set and encourage your child to use MCAS to check homework set and plan when they will do it
- Find a quiet space to work no TV or music
- Help them to organise their time around their other activities
- Let them do the work! This is independent learning
- Encourage your child to read
- Communicate with teachers about homework problems – planner, email or phone call


Learning Cycle Reports



- We report on progress three times a year
- We use a range of assessments to decide on the progress made
- At King James's we do not report a grade or number. The reason for not using grades or numbers is that pupils focus too much on the grade they achieved instead of how to improve work
- Pupils will also be awarded an Attitude to Learning descriptor for each subject. This is the most important measure of how students are 'performing' at school.

How can you help?

- We encourage you to attend parents' evenings so you can discuss progress with subject teachers
- •Look at exercise books. Look for green sheets which show teacher and pupil feedback on assessments. Also look out for the use of purple pen to improve work. This shows that pupils are actively engaged in improving their work.
- Also look at MyChildAt School to get regular updates from subject teachers – not just about progress




How to log-in to Student Portal

- 4. Go to your school email address to verify the link.







- Raises awareness of tolerance, responsibilities, integrity, determination and aspirations.



We've all got the same interests in mind – our students/your children – trust us.




Keep eye on MCAS – pick up on positives, negatives, punctuality, LC reports, homework.




