Please see a more detailed guide attached to the newsletter. If your child has a problem accessing the student portal, please ask them to see the IT technicians in school. There are two options for students to access the homework.

For mobile devices:

- 1. Download 'Bromcom Student app' in the app store (scan the QR code)
- 2. Enter a 5-digit pin code that you will need to remember
- 3. Select Magic Link and type in School ID 11433
- 4. Type in your child's school email address e.g., 18jsmith@king-james.co.uk
- 5. Go to your school email address to verify the link.

Black History Month



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Unlocking Autism for Parents

Assisting parental understanding of autism, communication and sensory needs.

Who is it for?

• Unlocking Autism is a free course for parents and carers of children and young people with communication and interaction needs. You must live in North Yorkshire or your child attend a North Yorkshire school or setting to be eligible. Children do not need to have a diagnosis of autism in order for parents to attend.

What will I learn?

• The programme includes sessions on behaviour, emotional regulation, Communication, sensory differences and autism providing practical tools and strategies to support children and young people.

When does the course take place?

• This is an online course which consists of five sessions which either run over two full days or as five, 2 hour webinars. It is recommended that parents/carers complete all five sessions in order to derive maximum benefit from the programme.

How do I book?
