Reminders about mobile phones in school

New guidance from the Department for Education expects schools to ban mobile phone use throughout the school day, including at break times, to tackle disruptive behaviour and online bullying while boosting attention during lessons. This brings England in line with other countries that have already implemented a ban, including France, Italy and Portugal. It follows warnings from the United Nations on the risks of smartphones in schools and government data that found that a third (29%) of secondary school students reported mobile phones being used when they were not supposed to.

To remind parents, this is our clear policy at King James's;

All mobile devices and AirPods/headphones need to be turned off and away from when students come onto site, until the bell at the end of the day.

After half term, we will be clearly reminding students of this policy and, from Monday 13th November, any student found with their phone out, without permission from staff, will have it confiscated.

Attendance

As discussed in the Expectations Evenings at the start of the year, research shows there is a very clear relationship between academic achievement and excellent school attendance. Every lesson at KJS matters and absence over time will also impact negatively on a child's social and emotional wellbeing. With this in mind, where possible, students attendance should remain above 95% (equivalent to 9 days of absence over the year.) At this stage in the year we are aware that any absence, will have a big impact on this figure and after a few weeks this will bounce back. However, we still feel it is necessary to raise awareness and introduce supportive measures so early intervention can be put in place for students who have genuine barriers regarding coming into school.

To help you and your child to monitor their attendance we will be doing the following at the start of each half term:

- Tutors will be asking students to record their current Year to Date attendance in their planners so they are aware and responsible for monitoring it
- Any students below 95% will be supported by their tutors (if necessary) with any barriers they may have
- Parents of students with an attendance figure of under 95% will receive communication, so you are aware & can monitor.
- Rewards and celebrating excellent attendance through different ways
- Providing useful guidance for parents through the website
