Flu vaccinations

On 25th and 26th October, the Immunisation Team will be coming into school to provide Flu Vaccinations for students. The Nasal spray and IM will be offered to all students in Years 7-11. The nasal flu vaccine is painless, quick, and side effects are uncommon and generally mild. The IM vaccine is administered into the upper arm. Common side effects are mild and short-lived.

This winter there is a very high risk that the NHS could be overwhelmed with illness caused by influenza, as we have not been mixing with others as much over the past few winters. Children and young people who have the flu vaccine are less likely to pass the virus on to friends and family, especially those who may be at greater risk from flu, such as young babies, elderly people or friends and relatives with a serious health condition.


