Mobile Phones

This week the government has issued new guidelines to schools about the use of mobile phones. The new guidelines allow pupils to bring their phones to school so they can be used on the journeys there and back but do not be allow them to be used during the school day. This guidance underlines the policy already held by KJS and reinforces the expectation that students must keep mobile phones switched off and in their bags/pockets. Any mobile phones that are seen will be confiscated.

Vaping

In May a letter was sent to parents which was signed by all Harrogate Headteachers about our collective stance towards vaping - please see letter here. Due to the unknown health risks, and emerging link to an increase in smoking in young people, we take a firm line towards students found vaping and our behaviour policy states that any student suspected of vaping on school site will receive one of our most serious consequences, including suspension. Homework

Many thanks for your support with homework. Most of our students are now able to access homework on their phone. Here are the instructions again for those who haven't managed to do this yet. Please see a more detailed guide attached to the newsletter. If your child has a problem accessing the student portal, please ask them to see the IT technicians in school. There are two options for students to access the homework.

For iphones or ios devices

- 1. Download 'Bromcom Student app' in the app store (scan the QR code)
- 2. Enter a 5-digit pin code that you will need to remember
- 3. Select Magic Link and type in School ID 11433
- 4. Type in your child's school email address e.g., 18jsmith@king-james.co.uk
- 5. Go to your school email address to verify the link.

For Android phones or the internet

- 1. Log on to www.bromcomvle.com (scan the QR code)
- 2. Select Microsoft login at the bottom of the page
- 3. Type in your email address e.g. 18jsmith@king-james.co.uk
- 4. Type in the password you use to log-in to a school computer.
