<b>Week 1</b>	<b>Module 1 – Qui suis-je?</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Learn vocabulary</li><li>• Present tense (regular, irregular and reflexives)</li><li>• Adjectival agreement</li><li>• Describe yourself and a friend/ family member</li><li>• Describe family relationships</li><li>• Future tense</li><li>• Perfect tense</li><li>• Describing an event in the past</li><li>• Imperfect tense</li><li>• Describing yourself when you were younger</li><li>• Talk about someone you admire</li></ul>
<b>Week 2</b>	<b>Module 2 – Le temps des loisirs</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Learn vocabulary</li><li>• Talk about what activities I do/ play with opinions and when</li><li>• Use the comparative and superlative</li><li>• Talk about how I use technology (in a variety of tenses)</li><li>• Talk about reading habits (in a variety of tenses)</li><li>• Direct object pronouns</li><li>• Talk about what I watch (in a variety of tenses)</li><li>• Talk about cinema and films</li></ul>
<b>Week 3</b>	<b>Module 4 – De la ville à la campagne</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Learn vocabulary</li><li>• Talk about the weather in the present, future and imperfect tenses</li></ul>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Describe where I live</li> <li>• Talk about what there is and what you can do in my town</li> <li>• Negative phrases (ne...pas, ne...jamais, ne...rien etc)</li> <li>• Describe the negative aspects and problems in my town</li> <li>• Describe community projects (in a variety of tenses)</li> </ul>
<b>Week 4</b>	<b>Grammar and translation</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Revisit the grammar points from each of the modules</li> <li>• Use languagesonline to practise key grammar points</li> <li>• Use the grammar and translation workbook to practice</li> <li>• Ensure you know key phrases in past, present and future tenses eg. I go, I went, I will go</li> </ul>
<b>Week 5</b>	<b>Practice listening, reading and writing questions</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Revisit the vocab and grammar from each of the modules</li> <li>• You can complete practice reading, writing and listening questions using the purple workbook</li> <li>• Do the resume sections from the online textbook</li> </ul>

### How to revise

The key is to apply your knowledge. Don't just re-write notes and copy them out. Practice and learn them! It is more beneficial to learn vocabulary little and often. You could write out cue cards and stick them up in your bedroom or take them out with you when you go out in the car or on the bus etc.
