# GCSE Photography Exam - Power Friday 01st March and Tuesday 7th May 2024

We will explore the **pink shoots** mainly on our research day and then the **green shoots** together as a cohort in class and for homework.

We will select two photographers for you, and you will choose at least 2 other Photographers to explore from this booklet whilst you are firming up your angle.

Preparation for this counts for half the marks of this exam. As the exam is 40% of the GCSE your preparation is 20% of the whole GCSE and as such is extremely important. If your coursework is a bit thin this exam is a fantastic opportunity to pick up a lot of marks to boost your grade.

You cannot get a GCSE without preparation.

#### Each double page shoot should resemble this layout.



- Spider diagram/contextual page of ideas: Refer to the exam paper and planned shoots.
- All shoots should include:
- Contextual images
- 6 edits (this is a minimum)
- X1 Photographer study (four should be annotated) and transcription.
- (Ensure you make many visual contextual links throughout all your edits)
- Unlimited number of final photos printed off on good quality paper (A4 size) – but a minimum of four .... This could of course be displayed in a different way i.e., a sculpture, hanging piece, textile piece etc.




