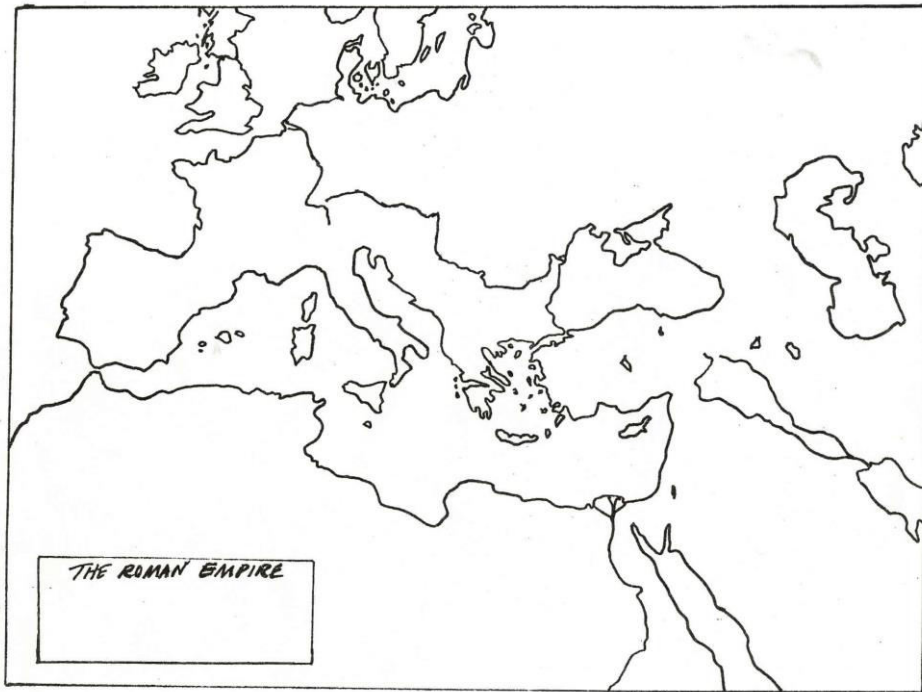
1) What does the creation story teach us about God?

Catch up work – LC3 - year 7 – Miracles



- 1) Write down the definition of a miracle and give an example.
- 2) Read the example of the miracle performed by Jesus and decide whether you think is a miracle or not. If not, what could the alternative explanation be?
Jesus and his disciples are out on a boat when suddenly a huge storm blows up. The disciples are afraid their boat may sink but Jesus says to the wind, and he waves 'be still' and the storm suddenly stops.

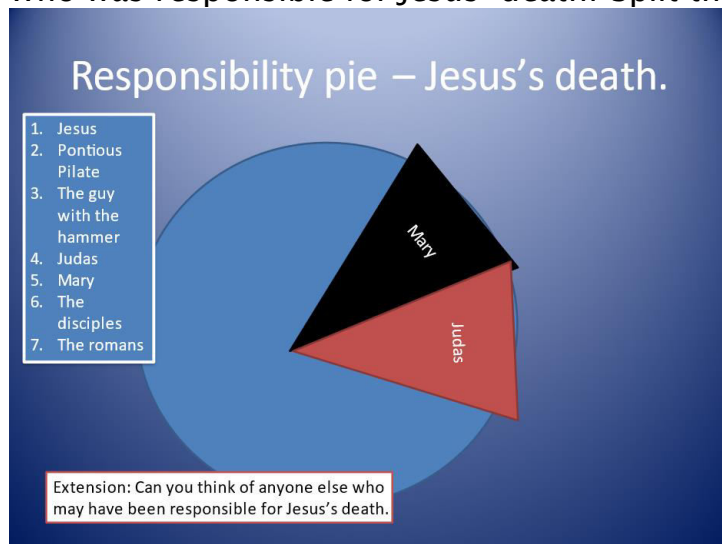
